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About the presenter

Dr. Michael D. Geschwind is a Professor of Neurology at the UCSF Memory and Aging Center who specializes in the assessment, treatment and management of rapidly progressive dementias, including prion diseases such as Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (CJD) and autoimmune encephalopathies, and other cognitive/movement disorder syndromes. His research interests include rapidly progressive dementias, cognitive dysfunction in movement disorders, such as Huntington's disease, spinocerebellar ataxia, corticobasal degeneration (CBD), progressive supranuclear palsy (PSP) and other Parkinsonian dementias.

Geschwind earned his medical degree and PhD in neuroscience through the Medical Scientist Training Program, sponsored by the National Institutes of Health, at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York. He is a professor of neurology and holds the Michael J. Homer Chair in Neurology in the UCSF School of Medicine.
